James Farrar, Statewide Director University of California IPM

Farrar oversees the University of California's Integrated Pest Management (IPM) partnerships across California. Farrar tracks IPM's impacts on the state's agriculture, communities and natural areas. He previously served as a plant pathology professor at Fresno State University and, more recently, was director of the Western IPM Center.

John Gerlach, Sr. Environmental Scientist DPR Pest Management and Licensing Branch

Gerlach oversees DPR's Pest Management Grant Program. He previously worked for the Water Board as a lead scientist on the Bay-Delta Water Quality Plan. Before that, he developed regional and multi-state rare species conservation plans, wrote invasive species management plans for Sequoia, Kings Canyon, and Yosemite National parks, conducted vernal pool and invasive species research, and ran cattle operations and controlled weeds on conservation lands.
