## What We Do At DPR

The California Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) protects public health and the environment by fostering sustainable pest management and regulating pesticides.

Pest management plays an integral role in the stability of California's healthy food supply, supports growers and agricultural sustainability, and protects the health of our urban and rural communities and our environment.

Evaluating pesticides for risks and impacts before they are registered in CA

DPR evaluates pesticide effects on human health and the environment through comprehensive review of studies before a pesticide can be registered for sale or use in California. This evaluation informs both registration decisions and supports DPR's continuous evaluation of pesticides to mitigate risks and impacts to people and the environment.

## Fostering Sustainable Pest Management

DPR advances safe, effective,
sustainable pest management through
Integrated Pest Management (IPM)
technical assistance and outreach,
providing tools to protect endangered
species, providing compliance assistance for
the Healthy Schools Act, offering grants and
tracking pesticide use statewide.

DPR's Continuous evaluation includes monitoring the air, groundwater and surface water for pesticides and performs comprehensive risk assessments for all populations (workers, children and other sensitive groups) to inform DPR's understanding of pesticide impacts and regulatory actions to mitigate risks to people and the environment.
