PERTAINING TO THE MINIMAL EXPOSURE PESTICIDE (MEP) LIST

The Department has withdrawn the proposed rulemaking action regarding the amendment of Sections 6000, 6790, and 6791 in Titles 3 and 26 of the California Code of Regulations. This action is taken because of new data received by the Department pertaining to chlorothalonil and atrazine.

**NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN  
REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PESTICIDE REGULATION  
Pertaining to Minimal Exposure Pesticides**


Notice is hereby given that the Department of Pesticide Regulation has withdrawn the proposed regulatory action regarding the amendment of Sections 6000, 6790, 6791, and 6792 in Titles 3 and 26 of the California Code of Regulations. The amendment was proposed to add atrazine and chlorothalonil to the Minimal Exposure Pesticide (MEP) list and remove folpet from the MEP list. The Notice, Initial Statement of Reasons, and text of the regulation were filed with the Office of Administrative Law on December 20, 1994.

This action is being taken due to the receipt of new data regarding these two chemicals. Upon review of the data the Department will determine the adequacy of mitigation measures needed for uses of these two chemicals.
