

How to Comply – Federal Endangered Species and Ecological Mitigation Label Requirements

Plan Ahead - Read the Pesticide Label

Review the label for Bulletins Live! Two and ecological mitigation measure language. These requirements are often found in the “Direction’s for Use” section of the label but may be in other sections.

Bulletins and ecological mitigation measures are enforceable as part of the registered pesticide product labeling. Always follow the most restrictive requirement.



Use Bulletin Live! Two (BLT):



- ▶ Bulletins provide for location specific endangered species protections.
- ▶ Search for potential Bulletins by entering the location, pesticide, and application month.
- ▶ Check for a Bulletin up to six months before applying the pesticide.

Visit EPA's Mitigation Menu:



- ▶ Ecological spray drift and runoff/erosion requirements may appear on the pesticide label or Bulletin.
- ▶ Options to reduce or mitigate these requirements may be available based on the application method, site condition, or other factors.
- ▶ Use EPA's Mitigation Menu or EPA's Pesticide App for Label Mitigations (PALM) tool to determine exclusions, mitigation measures, and to calculate the final spray drift buffer or runoff/erosion points achieved.

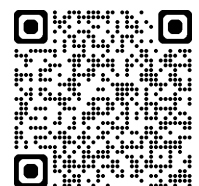

Keeping Records is Recommended:



- ▶ Print and keep Bulletins obtained within your six month application window.
- ▶ PALM printouts help document mitigation measures used for each application.
- ▶ Keeping records earns one runoff/erosion mitigation point for each application.
